















The Cleat Hitch

Callisto's Owner/Captain is anal when it come to making a proper Cleat Hitch. This has resulted from personal experience and his study of maritime accidents. Three simple steps:

Take the line to the horn of the cleat furthest from where the line comes from (the load).



Take one wrap around the base of the cleat and then start a figure eight across the top of the opposite ear.



Finish with a half hitch turned under so that the line is coming away from the cleat in the opposite direction from which it came in.



Any departure from the above simple steps is incorrect and not only unsafe but truly dangerous.

When I last wrote about this matter, our Board of Directors was making every effort to amend the squadron bylaws. In particular, we wanted to institute a more direct and effective method of transitioning our Bridge.

Our current bylaws provide for the election of new bridge officers in March of each year, followed three months later by their installation at the Change of Watch in June.

This three-month hiatus between election and installation was to allow the newly elected officers ample time to prepare for their new roles. However, this delay has also generated much frustration in those who must wait to be installed and begin conducting squadron business. As a result, the Board decided to amend our bylaws so that installation would immediately follow election in March.

We recently presented our amended bylaws to National for the required approval. To date, they have provided a lot of bureaucratic delays. National suggested that we postpone finalizing our amendments until after the national meeting in February. Our compliance with this will defer our new Change of watch policy.

Hopefully, National will approve our amended bylaws by this summer. Consequently, we will again hold our elections in March and install our new officers on 30 June 2018 at the Change of Watch at Sandpiper Cove.

A special shout-out to Mary Dodd, who has devoted a tremendous amount of time and work to improve our bylaws.

NOTICE OF ELECTION

NOTICE TO ALL ACTIVE MEMBERS: The election of officers for the 2018-2019 Bridge Year will be held at the

Squadron's Annual Meeting beginning at 7:00 P.M. on Tuesday, 13 March at Sandpiper's Cove Restaurant & Bar.

What you Need to Know

The Squadron's affairs are managed by the Board of Directors (Bylaws § 6.7). The members of the Board of Directors are the Commander, Executive Officer, Educational Officer, Administrative Officer, Secretary, Treasurer (collectively the Bridge Officers), 3 Members at Large, and the most recent past commander willing and able to serve (Bylaws § 5.4).

The Board of Directors is elected by the active members at the Annual Meeting in March of each year and takes office at the of Watch Ceremony the following June (Bylaws § 5.2).

Pursuant to Bylaws section 6.8, the Nominating Committee prepares a slate of officers for elected positions, which it then sends to the Secretary at least 40 days prior to the Annual Meeting. The Secretary is required to send to each active member a copy of the Nominating Committee's slate of nominees together with a written notice of the annual meeting (Bylaws § 9.3). Publication of the Secretary's notice and the Nominating Committee's slate of nominees in this edition of the Afterdeck News satisfies the notice requirement contained in the Squadron's bylaws (Bylaw § 9.6).

There are two other ways in which officers may be nominated for election: (1) Nominees by Petition - Written petition signed by at least five active members in good standing and filed with the Secretary at least 15 days before the annual meeting (Bylaws § 11.1); (2) Nominees for Vacancies in Nominating Committee's Slate - If vacancies exist in the Nominating Committee's Slate of Nominees, nominations may be made from the floor by active members at the Annual Meeting (Bylaws § 11.4).

Election to an uncontested office may be effected by a supported motion and a ballot cast and recorded by the Secretary (Bylaws § 11.5.2). Election to a contested office shall be by secret ballot, unsigned and cast in person (Bylaws § 11.5.3). No active member shall be eligible for nomination without first signifying a willingness and ability to serve if elected (Bylaws § 11.4).




