

Joyce was born the oldest of three children in Louisville, KY. When she was seven her mother died. From then on she was raised by her grandparents. She graduated from high school in 1955 and spent her career working in the Louisville and Jefferson County school districts. Starting out in a minor clerical Position, she rose, over the next thirty-one years, through the educational hierarchy to become a computer education specialist. Along the road, she collected a B.S. degree from the University of Louisville. Let us not forget that this period covers the birth of personal computers as we know them today. Remember the Ataris, Commodores, Apples, and IBM's that introduced most of us to the electronic age. Many a young schoolteacher in Joyce's district will remember her when they think of their early struggles with those 'primitive' machines.

In 1977 Joyce married Ed, our well remembered and respected squadron commander ('02-'03), whom she met as a fellow worker in the public school system.

Coincidentally, in the same year, Ed's mother retired and took up residence in the Gemini. Joyce and Ed visited regularly, finally moving here in the mid-nineties to be on hand as mother grew older.

Watching the myriad selection of boats passing up and down the waterway stirred Ed's hitherto dormant sailor instincts. A 19 ft Century center console was the result. This was to be followed by a 24 ft Bayliner which proved, in Joyce's words, to be a real lemon. Several hair-raising breakdowns were endured including a steering freeze in a narrow section of the busy weekend Intracoastal.

Happily, their purchase of a boat led to joining the squadron following a Boatsmart course taught by Fritz Bierschenk and Bill Eldridge in 1998. To describe the Newmans' contributions to the welfare of the squadron would take volumes. We all should be well aware of the accomplishments they have brought us through their dedication to our organization. Sadly, Ed passed away 19 January 2008, Joyce, in part, credits her ability to cope with the loss of her love of her life to the encouragement and



support she received from squadron members.

All being well, Joyce was our commander in 2011. She had many ideas and made a positive contribution. Tenacity is one of the many qualities we found in our leader. The squadron was well served when she took the helm.
