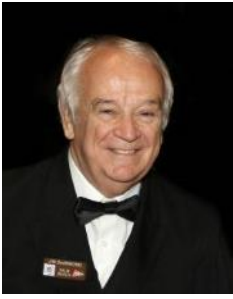

Operations Training:

As National is holding their Annual meeting 9-15 February 2020 at Ponte Vedra and February is the founding month of the United States Power Squadrons®, I thought it would be interesting to write about some fun facts about the National level of the United States Power Squadron.

The National level is where it all started, where the continuity is spelled out, where the mission and vision are defined, where the courses are developed and published, and where we approve and adopt that which unites the squadrons while allowing for their individuality.

National's Board of Directors is comprised of the National Bridge and the most recent past chief commander willing and able to serve, such directors to be elected by the Governing Board at its annual meeting. Their responsibilities are similar to a squadron's Board of Director or a District's Council.

The members of the Governing Board are made up of the

Chief Commander, Vice Commanders, Rear Commanders, members of the National general committee, District Commanders, District Educational Officers, Squadron Commanders, Past Chief Commanders (P/C/C), and Past Vice Commanders (P/V/C), Governing Board members Emeritus (those members who have 50 merit marks or more), Elected General Member (1 for each 600 members of USPS, and the Squadron Delegates (1 per each of the squadron's 100 members) If the Commander cannot attend, an alternate can also be designated and that too needs a signed authorization form from the Commander.

Hope you enjoyed learning about the National Level of the United States Power Squadrons. This information came from Operations Training in 3.

We need instructors!!!

We currently have about 20 Senior Navigators, 1 Navigator, 10 Junior Navigators, 33 Advanced Pilots, and 29 Pilots as members of our Squadron. You (yes, I'm talking to you!) have benefitted from the programs and volunteer instructors of the United States Power Squadrons. How about a little payback? Instructors are needed for Weather and Engine Maintenance. I have not been able to schedule these classes due to a lack of instructors. The only requirement is that you have to have taken the course in order to teach it. Haven't taken the course, but would like to? Self-study with a proctored exam is possible. A bit shy about talking in front of others (I used to be – no, really!)? We can help you with that – that's one of the functions of the Instructor Development course. If you are interested, please contact me.

Classes

Seamanship, taught by P/C Rick Wood, JN and Lt Katherine Redmond, AP, is currently in progress with 4 students. As mentioned before, this is the last class of Seamanship; the next class, starting in June, will be Boat Handling. Sail class was postponed until later this year due to circumstances beyond our control. The next class to start will be Cruise Planning on 7 May.

Instructor Development

So, nobody is interested?

This course is intended to train the trainers (teach the teachers?). It is required by law for instructors teaching a NASBLA-/state-approved basic boating course like ABC3. It is also highly recommended for all instructors. The emphasis is on enhancing presentation techniques and instructor skills. The course has been designed to demonstrate interactive teaching methods focused on adult learning. Students are required to prepare lesson plans and give presentations that are graded. This is the only FREE course given by USPS. The plan right now is to schedule an Instructor Development course later in 2020. **If you are interested, please contact me: seo@pbsps.org.**

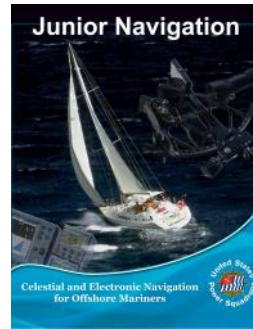
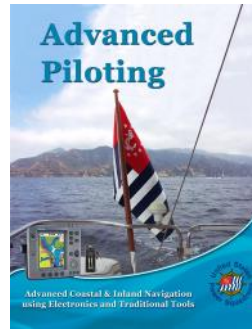
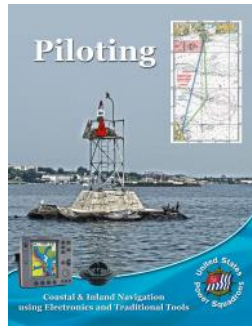
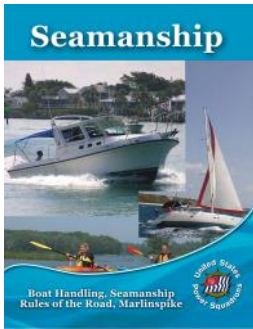
AKA the Boat Simulator. The January event was cancelled.

Pop Quiz Answer: Rule 18 of the USCG Navigation Rules and Regulations specifies that other vessels give-way to a VESSEL NOT UNDER COMMAND. Rule 27 requires a vessel not under command to have two all-round red lights in a vertical configuration ("red over red, the captain's dead") at night and two black balls in a vertical configuration during the day. Interestingly, if the vessel not under command is making way, it shall show sidelights and a sternlight in addition to the red over red lights.

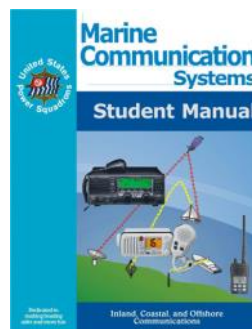
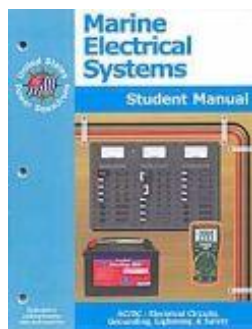
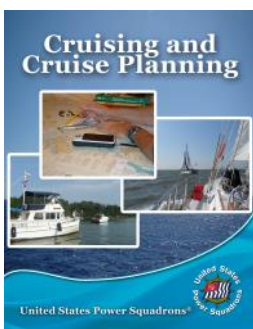

NOTICE OF ELECTION

NOTICE TO ALL ACTIVE MEMBERS: The election of officers for the 2020-21 Bridge Year will be held at the Squadron's Annual Meeting beginning at 8:00 P.M. on Tuesday 10 March, at North Palm Beach Country Club.

What you Need to Know

The Squadron's affairs are managed by the Board of Directors (Bylaws § 6.7). The members of the Board of Directors are the Commander, Executive Officer, Educational Officer, Administrative Officer, Secretary and Treasurer (collectively the Bridge Officers), Members at Large, and the most recent past commander willing and able to serve (Bylaws § 5.4). The Board of Directors is elected by the active members at the Annual Meeting in March of each year and takes office at the Annual Meeting. (Bylaws § 5.2).

Pursuant to Bylaws section 6.8, the Nominating Committee prepares a slate of officers for elected positions, which it then sends to the Secretary at least 40 days prior to the Annual Meeting. The Secretary is required to send to each active member a copy of the Nominating Committee's slate of nominees together with a written notice of the annual meeting (Bylaws § 9.3). Publication of the Secretary's notice and the Nominating Committee's slate of nominees in this edition of the Afterdeck News satisfies the notice requirement contained in the Squadron's bylaws (Bylaw § 9.6).

There are two other ways in which officers may be nominated for election: (1) Nominees by Petition - Written petition signed by at least five active members in good standing and filed with the Secretary at least 15 days before the annual meeting (Bylaws § 11.1); (2) Nominees for Vacancies in Nominating Committee's Slate - If vacancies exist in the Nominating Committee's Slate of Nominees, nominations may be made from the floor by active members at the Annual Meeting (Bylaws § 11.3)

Election to an uncontested office may be effected by a supported motion and a ballot cast and recorded by the Secretary (Bylaws § 11.5.2). Election to a contested office shall be by secret ballot, unsigned and cast in person (Bylaws § 11.5.3). No active member shall be eligible for nomination without first signifying a willingness and ability to serve if elected (Bylaws § 11.4).

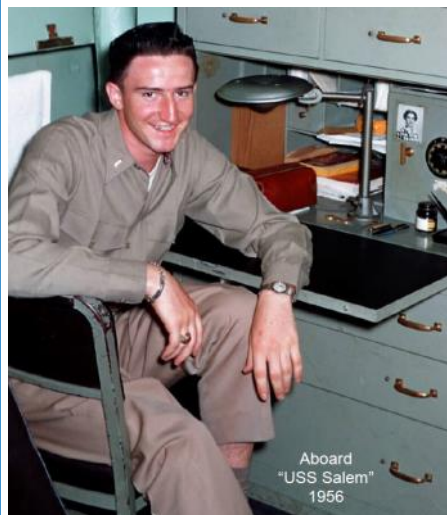
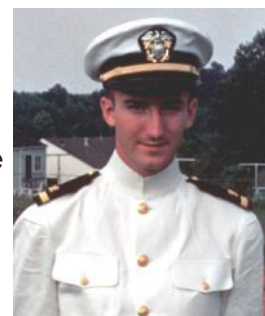
Meet Some Of Our Instructors!
