From the Educational Officer

The 2020 schedule for classes is published separately in this After-deck. Note: class schedules may change due to the current Coronavirus emergency. Affected students will be notified about changes to current classes. Notifications will be sent to advise of changes to future classes.

Pop Quiz: As mentioned last month, life jacket labeling is changing. Under the new rating system for flotation, what is the rating for an offshore life jacket, suitable for use in rough water and with an expected long time to rescue. It also is rated to turn most people face up in the water with no actions required by the wearer.

Some information from my Annual Report, submitted in March at the Board meeting (and on file):

The current membership educational makeup of our Squadron is: 20 Senior Navigators, 1 Navigator, 10 Junior Navigators, 33 Advanced Pilot, 31 Pilot, 17 Seamanship, 97 NO GRADE. We've lost members, so the numbers are down a little from last year. Why is it that almost ½ the membership hasn't taken an Advanced Grade class?

Class attendance could have been better. The following data covers classes held during the period 1 March 2019 to 1 March 2020:

Basic Boating Course: 40 students passed the course, down from 52 last year. We had to cancel three classes – two due to lack of students, and one due to instructor unavailability.

Advanced Classes (Seamanship, Piloting, Advanced Piloting, Junior Navigation, and Navigation): a total of 19 students attended the courses. This is a slight increase over the previous year.

Elective Classes (Cruise Planning, Engine Maintenance, Instructor Development, Sail, and Weather): a total of 16 attended the courses, the same as for the previous year.

There were some high spots:

D/C Ed Hoover, AP, is now the ASEO and will assist in Educational Department operations in the coming watch year (after he finishes with his District Commander responsibilities).

Last year, we welcomed Lt Hal Leahy, AP, as the new Marine Communications Systems instructor.

We also welcomed Lt Jon Arck, P, as the new Sail instructor (I'm giving it up after 20+ years).

Lt David Lee, P, has agreed to act as coordinator of the Jump Start program.

We successfully transitioned from BoatSmart to the latest USPS ABC3 (America's Boating Course, 3rd edition) for our basic boating class.

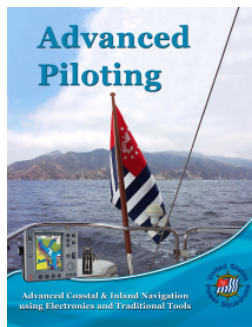
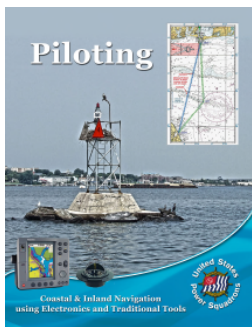
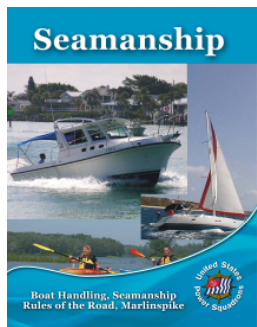
What's coming for this year:

Instructor Re-certification seminar: instructors who teach the public ABC3 course are required by NASBLA, USPS policy and Florida State law to be re-certified every four years. This is a means to update information an instructor gets from the Instructor Development course. It is highly recommended that instructors, even those with current certification, attend this seminar to see what's new in teaching (and there's a lot new). We are planning to hold a re-certification seminar in April or May.

Instructor Development class: attending and passing the full Instructor Development class (minimum of 8 weeks) is required for instructors of the ABC3 classes. While not required for other instructors, it is highly recommended. This class teaches how to teach; it also helps greatly with public speaking. One of the best courses USPS has. This class is planned for mid-year, June or July. It's also FREE.

Woman-to-Woman boating classes: Lt Katherine Redmond, AP, is heading up the preparation and presentation of boating classes designed to be taught by women to teach women. See her articles in recent USPS *Ensign* editions. These classes will be started in late Spring or early Summer.

OpenCPN seminar: OpenCPN is an open-sourced navigational software that has been included by USPS

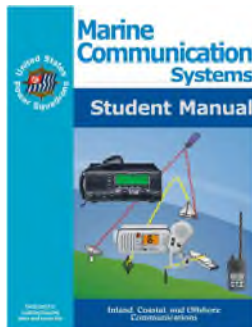
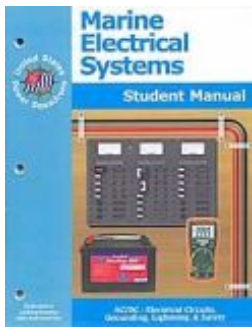
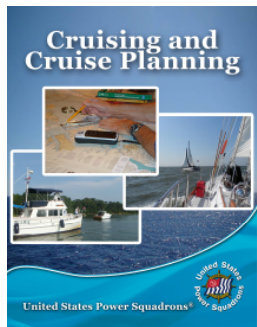

in Piloting and Advanced Piloting. It is installed on a laptop or tablet and can be used to plan a trip on a boat, then the information can be downloaded onto the chart plotter. This seminar will act as an introduction to OpenCPN.

Boat Handling (replaces Seamanship): we are currently in the process of converting from Seamanship to Boat Handling. The format of Boat Handling is different – a series of seminars, instead of the usual classes. People can take individual seminars for the information, or they can take all the seminars and pass an exam to pass Boat Handling (amusingly, the grade attained by this is Seamanship). The first seminar is scheduled for 15 June.

Pop Quiz Answer: The life jacket rated 150 (providing 150 Newtons of buoyancy force) is the effective replacement for the Type I life jacket and is suitable for offshore use in rough waters. There's also a life jacket rated 275; however, it is intended for commercial use such as fishermen.

From the Rules Chair

In March our squadron held our Annual Meeting and Change of Watch (COW) at the North Palm Beach Country Club so this month's article and following months' articles will discuss the responsibilities of the elected positions that you voted for.

Commander (Cdr): Our new Cdr is Cdr Calvin Cearley, P. The Cdr is the top ranking Officer. The Cdr presides at all meetings of the squadron, including the Board of Directors (BOD) meetings, and must be fully acquainted with all the activities of the Squadron. He is a voting member of all committees except Nominating, Auditing, and Rules. The welfare of the squadron is affected by the personality of the Cdr, who represents the squadron both nationally and in the district. He is also a voting member of the National (Governing Board and Annual Meetings) and District Meetings (Council & conference) and appoints voting delegates to the Conference and Governing Boards).

The Executive Officer (XO): Our

new XO is Lt/C Laura Zavalia, N. The XO has the rank of Lieutenant Commander (Lt/C). The duties of the XO are assisting the Commander; in the absence of the Commander the XO steps in. The XO is responsible for the External functions of the squadron, ex officio member of all committees in the XO department. The XO's attendance at District Conferences and Council meetings is expected and encouraged as the Cdr in training. Some Committees in the XO department are: Boat Shows, Cooperative Charting, Legislative, Liaison, Public Relations, Radio-Technical, Safety, and Vessel Safety Check.

Information for this article comes from the Operations Training Manual 2020 and the Operations Training in 3. Next month we will discuss the Squadron Educational Officer's position.

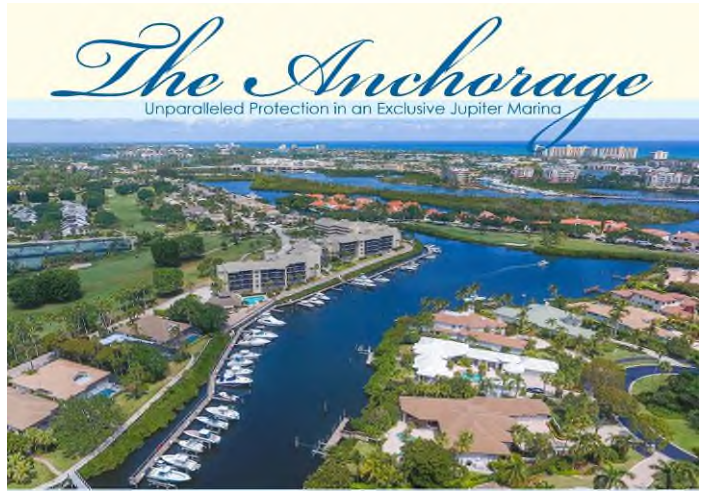
