



Report on January Activities

I had the honor of representing the BRSPS at the D23 Winter Council Meeting on January 13 in Daytona Beach.



Items discussed/ratified:

- USPS educational materials are copyrighted and if anyone adds slides, graphs, pictures, etc, the USPS logo/branding must be removed from that page.
- Seamanship will be renamed to "Boat Handling." The seminar has been rewritten as six two-hour classes with an exam at the end of each. It will be available in e-book and hard formats
- The Digital Media Library is available to download training videos at www.uspsdml.org.
- A Spanish ABC3 is now available.
- Piloting is being rewritten and organized as stand-alone segments each with its own exam. The new course will be named "Marine Navigation."
- D23 Spring Conference will be March 23-25. See Pages 20-21 for registration.
- The 2018 D23 budget will be the same as the 2017 budget.
- D23 will use "Free Conference Call" (FCC) in lieu of GoToMeeting for virtual calls.
- With the dissolution of the Titusville SPS effective March 31, the D23 banner will be modified to reflect the squadron change.

The Merit Mark Committee has the honor, privilege, and responsibility of preparing merit mark recommendations for those Active and Family members who have made substantial efforts on behalf of our Squadron during the calendar year 2016.

Trumpy Yacht "Freedom"

The 104ft fantail motor yacht *Freedom*, designed by John Trumpy, was the 181st built to come out of the Mathis Yacht Building Company since the builder's inception in 1910. Aubert J. Fay of Lowell, Massachusetts, was the client, but she went on to have several owners. Perhaps the most illustrious were Mr. and Mrs. J.P. Donahue of New York. As the daughter of F.W. Woolworth, Donahue was considered in 1930 to be one of the wealthiest women in the country. *Freedom* served as an extension to their Palm Beach home. When McMillen first laid eyes on *Freedom* in 2001 on the St. John's River, south of Jacksonville, Florida, the yacht had fallen on hard times, like so many of these vintage beauties.



Reconstruction began in 2005. At the height of the project, McMillen employed 25 skilled craftsmen, working approximately 4,000 man-hours per month. In the Newport area, classic yachts are revered; it was an honor to work on the restoration.

To wrap your mind around the project, Freedom from the deck down is brand new. The deckhouse framing and about 80 percent of the original mahogany paneling were salvaged, as well as a good deal of the original hardware, which has been rechromed and appears new. Amazingly, most of the porcelain in the baths is original, such as the 1920s bathtub. It was the deft hand of Elizabeth McMillen that made this boat come to life, through interior design and décor that respects the period with a modern flair. The art is in the details—and there are so many details aboard Freedom, such as 14 coats of varnish and details counting, that the visual effects of

coming upon the boat are simply stunning.

Freedom's traditional displacement hull shape is extremely efficient. It allows for comparatively small engines: two 526hp John Deere PowerTech engines with 44ft-long shafts, to push what is a 104ft, 156-ton boat to her cruising speed of 12 knots. Captain Brad Stahl reports that while cruising the Intracoastal Waterway, Freedom will burn about 17 gallons per hour, and about 22 to 25 gallons when cruising open waters. The ideal max is about 15 knots. But it's not about speed, it's about comfort.

The restoration took nearly seven years at a cost of seven million dollars, but in the video of the launching in May 2009, Earl McMillen is grinning from ear to ear. (Showboats International, May 2010)

Dates of Trip May 15 – 23 Yes, this is a mid week trip and our first in the month of May. We will arrive in Fort Lauderdale, Tuesday May 15, at Bahia Mar and cross the next day May 16 to North Bimini. We will return on May 23. We will stay at Bimini Big Game club on North Bimini. We presently have 15 slips and 8 rooms reserved. All of the island amenities are at North Bimini, beautiful clean beaches, fishing, snorkeling, diving, beach comb-ing, gambling, pools and great food.

The Big Game Club identifier for reservations and discounts is "BIMFG" (Bimini Fun Group). Double Tree by Hilton (hotel at Bahia Mar, if needed) 1-954-764-2233 May 15 Golf Cart Rental – cash only, Renee & Sluggo's Golf Carts. 1-242-473-5121 North Bimini is two miles long and carts are highly recommended either 2, 4 or 6 passenger. May 15 -23. The crossing from Fort Lauderdale to North Bimini is 54 miles of ocean open water. Boat sizes acceptable for this trip are minimum 26 foot and either a closed bow, cruiser or high gunwale fishing boats with through hull scuppers. No flats, bay or bowrider boats. In order to run with the group boats should be able to maintain 20 – 24 knots in open water.

Trailered boats will launch at Harbor Town Marina in Dania beach, just south of Fort Lauderdale. Truck and trailer parking for the week is \$10 per day. No reservation needed. Update: The dockage and room rates at BBGC have been reduced from 2017. Boats are now \$1.75 per foot and rooms are \$179 per night plus tax and fees. These prices are for early reservations only.

The trip is now ONLY FIVE months away. I encourage you take advantage of the next two months to make boat improvements and service. The boat service departments are slow now and many service price specials are offered. This also gets you ready for spring and test runs. GUEST SPEAKERS....Captain Dave Haslam & Nancy Haslam – Tall Ship Lady Washington Raised on Cape Cod, Captain Dave Haslam's interest in boating started early in his life when he bought his first boat at 15. His family owned a 28 foot Lobsterman. Dave and his wife, Nancy, purchased a Pearson 424 ketch which they sailed south from Seattle in September 2003. They spent a year-and-a-half in the Sea of Cortez, spending time in El Salvador and Costa Rica before continuing through the Panama Canal in April of 2005. Traveling north to Daytona they joined Daytona Sail and Power Squadron. They later transferred their membership to Titusville Sail and Power Squadron where Dave currently serves as CDR. He captained the Tall Ship, Lady Washington, with Nancy serving as his very able Deckhand, from Christmas Day 2008 to the end of September 2009, and has since been at her helm as Captain for three more voyages. During these times, he sailed up the West Coast, and up the Columbia River twice as far as Pasco, Washington (328 miles and 340 feet elevation via 4 dams). The Lady Washington is 112 feet, spared length, 90 feet loa, and 67 feet on deck. She weighs in at a petite 220 tons. She has 162 control lines, approximately six miles of lines, 13 sails and is totally voice powered. During the 2009 season Dave and Nancy took the Lady from San Diego up the West Coast to Puget Sound, through the Columbia River to Pasco (328 miles and 340 feet of elevation), all told they logged approximately 2500 nm.






