

KAYAK RACE

For the first time, the D23 Picnic will include a Kayak Race to replace the Cardboard Boat Race, discontinued for lack of participation.

Using the attached entry form, entries must be received by 30 April 2018. There is no fee for participation. The squadron asks that cancellations are received no later than 05 May 2018.

In case of inclement weather, all entrants will be notified via email by 11 May 2018.

FORMAT

There will be two race events:

One person kayak

Two person kayak

The number of persons in the boat will be the determining factor, not the size of the boat.

COURSE

The course will start and end at the same marker at the southern end of the course. Rowers will be required to race to the northern course marker, successfully going around the marker, before rowing south to the staring marker.

The course will run parallel 100 feet off the seawall in water depth of approximately 4 feet.

The winner will be adjudicated by the District Commander who will be located on shore at the finish line.

Ties may result in a run-off.

RULES

All boats will be inspected for sea worthiness

Boats may be fiber glass, wood, or inflatable kayaks (no home- built boats)

All participant must be squadron members as indicated by membership number on the application form. No non-member spouses or children.

All boaters are required to wear USCG approved life jackets

Rescue boats will be on the water in case of emergency

No interference with other boaters will be allowed.


Boaters must sign in by 1000 for race starts at 1030 and 1045 respectively.

New Safe Boating Website Just Launched

United States Power Squadrons and Boat Live 365



The movement to create a safe boating culture in all our communities has set sail, and the new BoatLive365.org website is live!

Boat Live 365[™] (pronounced like "alive") is a movement to help raise awareness about boating safety 365 days a year, not just during boating season.

The website is a critical step to enable recreational boating advocates to more effectively educate our boating public year-round and lower the rate of boating accidents, incidents and fatalities nation-wide.

<u>BoatLive365.org</u> includes a collection of educational and promotional materials and best practices created and curated by United States Power Squadrons and other leading safe boating advocates, such as the U.S. Coast Guard, the National Safe Boating Council and the National Association of State Boating Law Administrators (NASBLA).

Topics on the website reflect key areas of interest prescribed by the U.S. Coast Guard (e.g., the dangers of cold-water immersion, the importance of wearing a life jacket, boating under the influence, etc.) to ensure that prioritized dangers, small and large, are kept top of mind for the boating public.

According to the U.S. Coast Guard's Boating Statistics, 77 percent of deaths occurred on boats where the operator did not receive boating safety instruction. In contrast, only 13 percent of deaths occurred on boats where the operator had received a nationally approved boating safety education certificate.







AMERICA'S BRATING CLUB

BANANA RIVER SPS DRAGON POINT NAVIGATION CHALLENGE

(An Application of Traditional Dead Reckoning Navigation Skills)

OBJECTIVE

To navigate several prescribed legs of a Course as accurately as possible. The winner will be determined by the shortest distance between the Ending and Target coordinates of the last leg.

PARTICIPANTS

<u>The Committee</u>: Organizes the event, creates the routes, determines the starting order, issues the starting instructions and determines the final ranking of the participants.

<u>The Pilot</u>: Responsible for navigating the prescribed route by using the given parameters and compensating for deviation, leeway, wind, traffic, turning drift and any other factors. May be assisted by a Navigator.

The Observer: Selected by the Committee, will be assigned to each Pilot. The Observer verifies compliance with the rules.

RULES

- Any vessel, power or sail, may participate.
- Boats must meet all federal and local safety requirements.
- It is the responsibility of the Pilot to ensure the safety of their vessel by avoiding collisions, groundings and entanglements. This event will be held in open water, the Pilot must be aware of their surroundings. There will be nonparticipating vessels present, as well as other floats and debris. The Committee will attempt to keep all courses within water that is at least 6 feet deep.
- One week to ten days before the contest each Pilot will receive a unique Course consisting of seven legs covering 6-8 nm.
- For each leg of the Course, the Pilot will be given the Magnetic Heading and Distance in nautical miles.
- On the day of the competition, the Pilot will receive a numbered float, line and anchor weight.
- The Pilot determines his speed for the Course, which will be between the Pineda Causeway (Rte 404) and Eau Gallie Causeway (Rte 518) using Chart 11472.
- Different Courses will be assigned to minimize congestion.
- The starting point will be day mark G "1" at the end of Dragon Point (southern tip of Merritt Island) 28º 08' 30.73" N and 080º 36' 12.55" W.
- Pilots will start their runs at intervals as instructed by the Committee via VHF Channel 71.
- The Pilots must navigate each leg in the order given.
- The use of GPS, Loran, radar or similar position indicating devices during the run is not permitted. If one is on board, the Observer will cover the position display for the duration of the run leaving only the depth and speed indicators visible. The use of Autopilots or self-steering devices is not permitted.
- A GPS will be allowed to only display Speed Over Ground. No other readouts are permitted.
- When the Pilot determines that he has reached his exact end point, he will jettison the marked buoy. The final
 position will be measured at the buoy when the Committee reaches it, not the anchor position.
- The Target Coordinates will not be within the ICW, so avoid leaving the floats within the ICW channel.

DETERMINING THE WINNER

The standings will be based on the distance between the Target and actual Ending coordinates. The winner will be the one with the shortest distance.


