

FROM THE SQUADRON MEMBERSHIP CHAIRMAN: P/D/C Bob Becker, SN

I wonder how many of our members know the history of Banana River Sail and Power Squadron? If you have been a member for at least a few years you probably know the squadron was started in 1956. But what else do you know about our squadron? Well here goes with a history lesson



In early 1956 several south Brevard boaters requested the formation of a local Power Squadron. This came about due to there being several squadrons in Florida. Daytona Beach Squadron having been in existence since 1954 was contacted and asked to set up a Piloting Class in the Melbourne area. The class was conducted in

the Eau Gallie area at one of their public schools. Sixteen students took the course and passed the examination in June 1956. On 16 July an organizational meeting was held to chose a name (Banana River) for the squadron, By-Laws which had been written based on Daytona Beach By-Laws were presented and adopted and Loren Fisher was elected as the first Banana River Commander.

Representatives from District 8 as well as the Daytona Beach Squadron Commander were in attendance to represent the USPS National Organization. Sixteen Charter members applied for a USPS Charter. When the Charter was received it was dated 10 September 1956. Banana River had come into existence. The Squadron carried on a very active educational program conducting several courses which saw all sixteen members sign up. The Banana River Commander attended the D 8 Fall Conference and reported the squadron had sixteen members and was actively recruiting new members. Many years later we became part of the then newly formed USPS District 23 and we are the most southern squadron within the District.

That was our beginning. Some 62 years have now past and we are still in existence. Much water has flowed under the area causeway bridges since then. We have a good history which members can be proud of.

Over the years courses have been added and changed, Membership has dropped somewhat, leaders have come and gone, and we are now pushing "America's Boating Club" for name recognition. Membership is our number one priority

Most recently we have had our Change of Watch and our squadron officers are in place. Our new year has thus begun. It is now up to us, our membership, to support our leaders. How? Get active and get involved!! Attend meetings, join a committee, and participate in squadron activities. Read our news letter for upcoming events. Our new year promises many activities that include something for everyone. And always be on the lookout for new members. Let's build our membership to one hundred members. It's up to YOU!!!








D23 Fall Conference
