



REFLECTING ON 2018

2018 has been an active and successful year for BRSPS. Our physical year runs from November 1 to October 31 and during that time this past year we offered to our members and the community:

Christmas Boat Parade on Dec 14
Holiday Party on Dec 18
VHF Radio Workshop on Feb 10
Samsons Island Open House o Feb 17
Moved storage to new "Crib" on Mar 10
Flare-Up & Eau Gallie Cleanup May 19
Navigation Challenge on Jnne 30
Corn Roast on July 14
Indian River Depth Survey on Aug 31
Annual Business Meeting on Sept 17
Change of Watch on Oct 13

There were 12 general membership meetings with 9 guest speakers; 12 executive committee meetings, and 12 newsletters distributed to members, District 23 and USPS Bridge members.

Our membership started with 68 active and 2 associate members and ended in November with 61 and 2; a decrease of 15 but an increase of 8. Obviously, this is an area we MUST focus on in 2019.

BRSPS presented its second annual \$1000 Keiser Scholarship to a 2nd year nursing student.

The Education Dept was busy as well with 3 Jr Basic Boating held in April, June, and July. Recently, while dining at a local café the waitress



asked, "are you the ones who taught the boating classes to kids this summer?" She said her 12 year old son attended the June course and thoroughly enjoyed it, passing with a score of 89.

There were 3 ABC3 classes in March,

August, and November.

Operations Training was held in January.
Advanced Piloting in April thru May.
Weather in Sept thru October
Vessel Safety Check class in October
In the 10 courses offered, there were 90 students with 64 taking the final exam (an 89% pass rate).

All this said, there were countless hours devoted to Squadron activities by about one-half of the Squadron membership.

- more membership involvement.



There will also be a "gag gift" Swap Exchange, so clean out the closet and bring a wrapped gift to enter. Nothing is too small, too big, or too impractical!!





The small-boat toolbox

What tools do you need on board?



Toolboxes differ. What you need for a larger craft may be inappropriate for a smaller boat. How you will use a small toolbox, where you can store it, and what you put in it are considerations you need to take into account when you decide what's right for your boat.

Let's look at the container first. You could throw stuff into an inexpensive plastic box, but will it last and will it protect the stuff you store inside? Your best bet is to get a good quality box like a Pelican water-proof container. These watertight, rigid gasket-sealed boxes take a ton of abuse With different sizes available, you can find one to fit your contents and your boat's storage space.

Next, consider where you will be going. Chugging along in a small harbor is totally different from running 15 miles offshore to fish. The tools you need should be appropriate to the usage you expect.

First on any boater's list should be the universal fix-it: duct tape. Enclose it in a plastic zip-lock bag.

Next, add various size electrical tie wraps. These are great for attaching and holding things together, making temporary clamps, and other related uses. You also need a knife or multitool. These tools allow you to do various jobs with fewer tools, freeing up space. Often Costco has these at a reasonable price Spend the money to get a good tool, not an inexpensive knockoff.

Water pump pliers, which an be adjusted to various open sizes, are great. These are used to bolt or unbolt things, and the length of the handle gives good leverage. Add a pair of vice grips to give you locking leverage to a project.

The Small-Boat Toolbox continued

A medium-size adjustable wrench is an asset. Add a large and small Phillips head and a flat-head screw-driver to the box, and if your multitool does not have a wire cutter, add a medium size one as well. Put in a roll of electrical tape and a small roll of bailing wire.

In another plastic zip-top bag, store some bandages, hydrogen peroxide, and first-aid cream or ointment In another baggie, keep some spare change for phone calls in case your cell phone is out of range but you have access to a payphone. Add a \$10 prepaid phone card to one of the baggies.

Keep several rags, a signaling mirror, and a whistle in a zip-top bag. Finally, add several more zippered bags of various sizes. They can be used to store all sorts of stuff as well as your car keys, cellphone, and other electrical devices.

With all this, you now have the start of a toolkit you can modify to your own use. In case you need it, you will be happy to have it. Start one now, add a card and a pencil to write other ideas down on, and keep the box organized.




