

Volunteers are needed to retrieve items from the Crib (our storage unit) to bring along with! Volunteers are needed to transport supplies to our assigned location on the island!







The Last Naval Battle of the American Revolution in American Waters





The battle strategy began on March 9, 1783, when the *Alliance*, led by Capt. John Barry, and the *Due de Lauzun*, under command of Capt. John Green, divided their precious cargo of \$72,000 Spanish silver dollars and other specie that were badly needed by the Continental Congress in Philadelphia.

Off the coast of what is today Fort Pierce they completed the transfer and headed northward along the Florida coast.

At this same time, the British ships *Alarm*, a 32-gun frigate commanded by Capt. Charles Cotton; *Sybil*, 28-gun frigate led by Capt. James Vashon; and *Tobago*, 18-gun sloop-of-war with Capt. George Martin at the helm, met off Cape Canaveral and began cruising southward, looking for the American ships.

The British ships were spotted by Barry on the morning of March 10, 1783. Barry decided to head southwest for the protection of the Spanish fleet, which he knew was sailing for a raid on Jamaica. As they tried to escape, the slower ship, the *Due de Lauzun*, lagged behind. Barry slowed his ship for the *Due de Lauzun* to come alongside and advised Green to jettison his cannon to lighten his ship. A fourth ship appeared on the horizon and the British ships shifted their positions, one breaking off from the pursuit.

Barry decided that the fourth ship was an ally, so he made the daring move to engage the one British ship, *Sybil*, which was closing in, and thus buy sufficient time for the *Due de Lauzun* to escape to safety. Barry deliberately placed his ship between the *Due de Lauzun* and the oncoming Sybil. The *Sybil* continued firing her cannon and the *Alliance* took several shots. One smashed into the captain's cabin, killing a master's mate and wounding several others.

Barry left the quarter deck and personally walked from cannon to cannon encouraging and cautioning his men to not fire until he gave the order himself. He wanted to lure the enemy in as close as possible, *"half a pistol range."* The *Alliance* took a full broadside from the *Sybil* and still did not fire her cannon.

At the last moment, Barry ordered the main topsail raised to mast to position the *Alliance* directly abreast of the *Sybil*. At the order from Barry the full fury of a broadside from his ship was unleashed upon the *Sybil*. The British guns went silent after 40 minutes of close fighting; the *Sybil* lost two sails and had considerable damage to her hull. The *Sybil* quickly broke off from the fight and fled back to the other British vessels. Her casualties were reported to range up to 37 killed and 40 wounded. Thanks to the courage and skill of Barry, both American ships completed their mission and on March 20, 1783, the *Alliance* sailed into New Port, R. I., abandoning the plan to return to Philadel-phia because of the strong presence of a British patrol.

Thus, the last naval battle of the Revolutionary War was fought and won off the coast of Florida just south of Cape Canaveral ---sealing another American naval victory.



Greetings!

I am assisting with the celebration and remembrance of the last naval battle of the American Revolution that took place off of Cape Canaveral on 10 March 1783. As a maritime organization, and the fact that this historical event took place right here offshore, I thought your organizations might be interested in participating.

The commemoration of the last Naval Battle of the American Revolution usually musters at 0900 and begins at 1000 lasting approximately 90-120 minutes at the Brevard Veterans Center behind the Merritt Island Mall. Patriotic and maritime organizations from all over the US send representatives and attend in military attire from different time periods. This event is organized by the Sons & Daughters of the American Revolution. There have been as low as 30 and as high as 200 organizations attending most marching/walking in with a Color Guard. The US Sea Cadets volunteer to assist those who cannot carry their colors. I do not have a count of the number of organizations attending at this time.

The CG Station usually provides a four person Color Guard depending on operational availability. The AUX will have a two person Color Guard.

Duties of the Color Guard: Carry the US & your organization flag approximately 300 feet outside and place them in a stand by the dais and then sit down. (no prolonged standing). Any additional members (preferably in uniform) who wish to attend either march/walk in behind the Color Guard and then sit down or immediately go sit in the stands and show their support for the event.

There is also a voluntary wreath presentation ceremony. (not every organization participates in this)

As you might expect, there is a retelling of the event, there are guest speakers and each organization is recognized over the PA system as they pass by. Each participant is given a certificate of participation (actually a very nice one "suitable for framing" certificate) and each Color Guard is given a "battle ribbon" as a keepsake that they may attach to their flagstaff. There is a registration form and no fee to participate. I do not have a copy of the form at this time.

I hope your organization considers participating in some way.

Sandy will be sending the info to the Squadron Education Officer and also to the student that has request the course. She has a great letter that she is sending out. Please follow up; a great chance for new members. "Thanks Sandy"

The BOC Program is still alive with a number of changes. All Certifiers will need to take the new Seminar to keep their status current.

There are a number of new seminars in the works for 2019.

The new Boat Handling Course has moved out of the pilot program. We held a class in Jacksonville, the committee did a great job on this course. There were no issues with the e-book version.

Dear Commanders;

I write to ask you to help your national Committee on Nominations encourage interest among members in D23 to get involved in our America's Boating Club at the national level. We have opportunities for members of all interests and abilities.

First I want to dispel a couple of rumors:

- The minimum requirement for holding a national office is <u>Membership in</u> <u>USPS</u>! You do not need to be an N or JN or a P/D/C! Most national committees are looking for help.
- The national committees are run by members, each of whom is culturally empowered to act. Although USPS has a hierarchy of leadership, those in power are not dictators, but rather enablers. The work at national is all about operating and improving our organization and making sure our members have available to them what they need to maximize the value of their membership.

I would encourage you to read National Education Officer Craig Fraser's article (Attached). In it he confirms that there is a simple, easy progression to enable every member to participate at the National level. How to Register Online




