What's In A Name?





Why change our name, you ask? Times are changing. Our name, United States Power Squadrons, does not resonate with the public. What does a "squadron" mean? What does "power" mean? Nowhere does it imply that we are a boating organization.

Todays boaters are different from our traditional members.

- Many have smaller boats, less than 26 feet, and are on a trailer. Most of them boat on rivers and lakes and are not interested in learning piloting or navigation.
- Many boaters fit boating into their lifestyle, but it may not be a primary focus. They have busy lives and often have older children at home.
- Young people who enjoy the water are more interested in paddle sports such as kayaking, canoeing, and paddle boarding as well as fishing and sail surfing.

America's Boating Club -For Boaters, by Boaters is exactly what we are.; a boating organization. It allows us to continue to promote education, having fun, and be a service in the community.

The logo is modern and includes elements of power, sail, and paddle craft. It shows fluidity, movement, and water. It demonstrates action and is forward looking.

Thus, we need to update our image in order to appeal to today's boaters. Our name must identify who we are and why someone should be interested in what we do. That includes moving away from "Banana River Sail and Power Squadron." Our prospective membership lives from Rockledge to the Sebastian River, the southern half of Brevard County, i.e. South Brevard. Our current membership boats on the Indian River, Turkey Creek, Sebastian Inlet, as well as the Banana River.

Remember, we are officially United States Power Squadrons, and the Squadron is legally known as Banana River Sail & Power Squadron, but we will be doing business as America's Boating Club of South Brevard for public marketing purposes.

Are our dues to high or not high enough?


Do you read the Dragon Tales monthly publication?

TOPIC: Our Experiences on the Tall Ship "Mary Washington"

Raised on Cape Cod, Captain Dave Haslam's interests in boating started early in his life when he bought his first boat at age 15. His family owned a 28 foot Lobsterman.

Dave and his wife, Nancy, purchased a Pearson 424 ketch which they sailed south from Seattle on I September 2003. They spent a year and a half in the sea of Cortez, spent a while in El Salvador and some time in Costa Rica, then continued through the Panama Canal in April 2005. They came north to Daytona where they joined the Daytona SPS, later became Commander of Titusville SPS, and now are members of Cocoa Beach SPS.

He captained the Lady Washington from Christmas Day 2008 to the end of September 2009 and since has captained her three more times. During these times, he sailed her up the West Coast, up to the Columbia River twice as far as Pasco Washington (328 miles and 340 feet elevation via 4 dams).



THE LADY WASHINGTON



Lady Washington is a ship name shared by at least four different 80-100 ton-class Sloop-of-war and merchant sailing vessels during two different time periods. The original sailed during the American Revolutionary War and harassed British shipping. Post war, the vessel was used as a merchant trading vessel in the Pacific. A somewhat updated modern replica was created in 1989. The replica has appeared in numerous films and television shows, standing in as other real or fictional ships

A ship replica of *Lady Washington* was built in Aberdeen, Washington, United States in time for the 1989 Washington State Centennial celebrations. Aberdeen is located on Grays Harbor, an inlet of the Pacific Ocean named for Robert Gray, the man who entered the harbor under sail for the first time as master of *Columbia*.

Named "Washington State's Tall Ship Ambassador", as well as the State Ship, the new *Lady Washington* is operated by a professional and volunteer crew under the auspices of the Grays Harbor Historical Seaport Authority. She sails up and down the Pacific coast, regularly in pair with *Hawaiian Chieftain*, educating students in the history of merchant trading, life of common sailors, and responsibilities of the ship's officers.

Lady Washington has appeared in various films, portraying HMS Interceptor in the film Pirates of the Caribbean: The Curse of the Black Pearl and the brig Enterprise, a namesake of the Starship Enterprise, on the holodeck in Star Trek Generations. She provided the basis for the RLS Legacy in the Disney animated feature Treasure Planet. She also transported Chinese immigrants to America in the IMAX film The Great American West. On television, the ship played a prominent role in the miniseries Blackbeard, and has appeared in the music video for rapper Macklemore's Can't Hold Us and as Captain Hook's ship the Jolly Roger on Once Upon a Time.
