National Safe Boating Week: May 18-24, 2019

At the core of the 2019 Safe Boating Week campaign are the 4 key messages that ABC-SB has been consistently delivering to the boating community. These figures speak for themselves.

The following statistics are from the US Coast Guards 2017 Recreational Boating Statistics as reported by the National Safe Boating Council: In 2017, there were 4,291 reported accidents; 658 reported deaths; 2,629 reported injuries; \$46M dollars of damage to property as a result of recreational boating accidents

• Wear a PFD or Lifejacket

76% of boating deaths due to drowning

84.5% of victims not wearing a life jacket

2/3 of the drowning victims were good swimmers

Don't Drink & Boat

19% of deaths where the primary cause was known as alcohol as the leading factor

Take a Boating Course

81% of deaths occurred on boats where the operator had no boating safety instruction

I in 3 of all boating injuries occurred in boat operators over the age of 35

Be Wary of the Weather

Before going boating, fishing, diving or enjoying other water sports, check the forecast from <u>weather.gov</u> or your favorite weather source.. Monitor storms via:

FROM THE EDUCATION DEPARTMENT BY SEO P/C Jim Merker, AP

I need YOUR help! Do you remember the first time you were truly in charge of your own boat? Looking back, what do you wish someone would have told you before you took on that responsibility? We are working to put together a new boat owner orientation and could use YOUR input.



The national organization has developed a program called "Jumpstart" which is designed to provide a helping hand to owners/operators who are new to their boat. This program creates an outline for how we go about providing on-the-water training but comes up a little short on pre-departure presentation materials. This is where you come in: think about what you should have been told and what needed to be emphasized to you. We aren't going to be able to teach the entire Basic Boating Course, but we need a primer that can be provided in two to three hours. It will be just enough to get safely off the dock and back, and more importantly show them just how much more they truly need to learn. I greatly appreciate your help with this!

On a separate note, we have a BONUS engine tear-down session scheduled for Saturday, 4 May from 1000-1230. This one will be a bit more ad-hoc that usual. We will be disassembling the lower unit and trim ram of the Honda 90. Taking apart lower units has been a lot more miss than hit in my experience, but one way or another it's going to happen. I've got plans...

The annual Flare-Up will be I June. Bring your old flares and try them for yourself. We coordinate the proper permissions to launch aerials and pop smokes, so check out the flyer and plan to join us!

Lastly, our second Junior Basic Boating Class is scheduled for 24-26 June at the Schechter Community Center in Satellite Beach. For registration details go to the Satellite Beach Recreation Department website at playsatellitebeach.org and look up summer camps.



Marine Resources Council is a mangrove aquaculture facility, licensed and permitted by the Florida Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services. In our mangrove restoration program, we care for the three species native to Florida (red, black, and white), a total of approximately 4,000 plants. These mangroves will all eventually be transplanted along the Indian River Lagoon to provide nutrient uptake, wildlife habitat, storm protection, and erosion control.

By the end of 2018, we will plant almost 1,000 mangroves along the IRL shore-line through multiple projects funded privately and publicly by the Save Our Indian River Lagoon Project Plan.

MRC is always accepting propagules so next time you are on the beach it is easy to help our restoration efforts by collecting seeds and dropping them off to us at the Lagoon House!

KAYAK RACE

The second annual kayak race event will be held at the D23 Titusville Picnic. Last year's event was a huge success and there are requests for a re-match!

Using the attached entry form, entries must be received by 08 May 2019. There is no fee for participation but we need to know how many will attend.

In case of inclement weather, all entrants will be notified via email by 17 May 2019.

FORMAT

There will be two race events:

One person kayak

Two person kayak

The number of persons in the boat will be the determining factor, not the size of the boat.

COURSE

The course will start and end at the same marker at the southern end of the course. Rowers will be required to race to the northern course marker, successfully going around the marker, before rowing south to the staring marker.

The course will run parallel 100 feet off the seawall in <u>water depth of approximately 4 feet.</u>

The winner will be adjudicated by the District Commander who will be located on shore at the finish line.

Ties may result in a run-off.

RULES

All boats will be inspected for sea worthiness

Boats may be fiber glass, wood, or inflatable kayaks (no home-built boats)

All participant must be squadron members as indicated by membership number on the application form. No non-member spouses or children.

All boaters are required to wear USCG approved life jackets and shall have whistles or other sounding devices.

Rescue boats will be on the water in case of emergency




