**2020 Disaster Preparedness Sales Tax Holiday
May 29 through June 4, 2020**

The 2020 Disaster Preparedness Sales Tax Holiday begins on Friday, May 29, 2020, and ends on Thursday, June 4, 2020. During this sales tax holiday period, qualifying items related to disaster preparedness are exempt from sales tax.

The sales tax holiday does not apply to:

- the rental or repair of any of the qualifying items listed below
- sales in a theme park, entertainment complex, public lodging establishment, or airport

Notice to Businesses with Multiple Locations

If you report sales tax for all of your locations on one consolidated tax return, this publication was mailed to the main business address listed on your return. This publication was not mailed to each of your locations. Please be sure to notify all of your individual store locations about this sales tax holiday and the specific provisions in this publication. A list of qualifying items and a copy of this publication are available on the Department's website at floridarevenue.com.

Hurricane Sales Tax Holiday!

May 29—June 4, 2020



The 2020 Disaster Preparedness Sales Tax Holiday has been passed by the Florida Legislature and signed into law by Governor DeSantis (Chapter 2020-10, Law of Florida). This tax holiday begins on Friday, May 29, 2020 and ends on Thursday, June 4, 2020.

During this holiday period, qualifying items related to disaster preparedness are exempt from sales tax. However, the sales tax holiday does not apply to the rental or repair of any of the qualifying items. Additionally, the sales tax holiday does not apply to sales in a theme park, entertainment complex, public lodging establishment or airport.

During the period, shoppers will be able to avoid paying sales taxes on items such as reusable ice packs that cost \$10 or less; flashlights and lanterns costing \$20 or less; gasoline and diesel fuel containers costing \$25 or less. coolers and batteries costing \$30 or less; and radios and tarps costing \$50 or less.

The biggest-ticket items included in the holiday are portable generators that cost \$750 or less.

The discounts are not available at businesses in airports or at public-lodging facilities and can't be used to buy car and boat batteries. The discounts also can't be offered at theme parks and entertainment complexes.

L/C Monika Bradley provided numbers for both savings and checking balances.

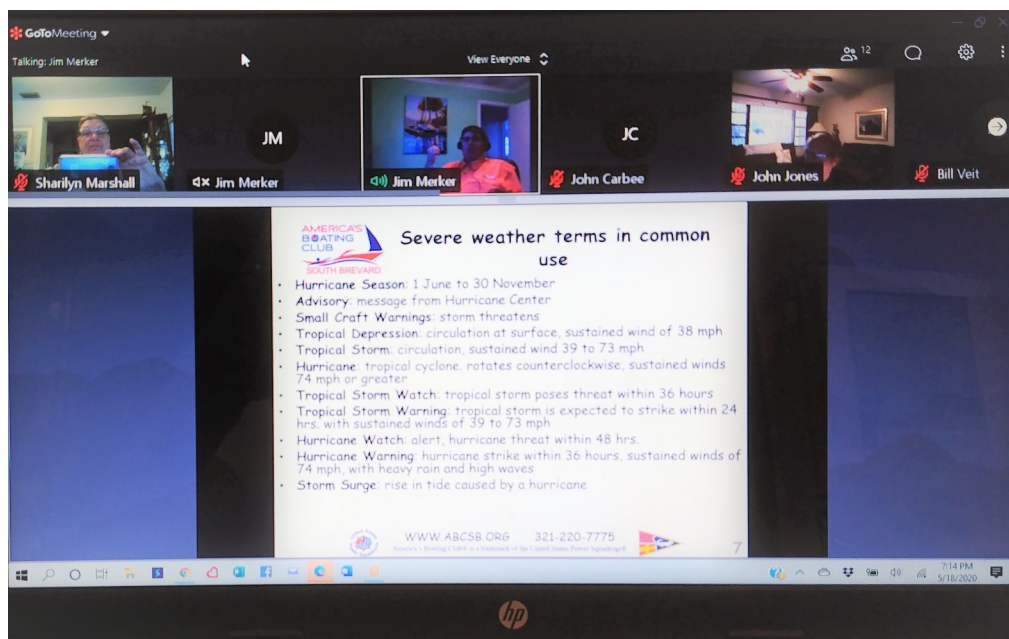

Jim recently spoke to Marty Lafferty, America's Boating Club Channel Live Episode 6. This interview will be shown on Wednesday May 13.



The June 19 on-line meeting will be a seminar on Boating Safety. Stephanie Murphy will create this presentation from various sources.

Once we can start having classes again, we will blitz out notices to the local yacht clubs and marinas and get new class cards out to the boat ramps. **Jr. Basic Boating classes are set for June 22-24 and July 13-15.**

A Boat Handling (replacing Seamanship) course has been postponed with a TBD date.

Ernst also asked about website updates that are needed. One of the updates would be to offer a **PayPal interface to allow people to pay using this option**.

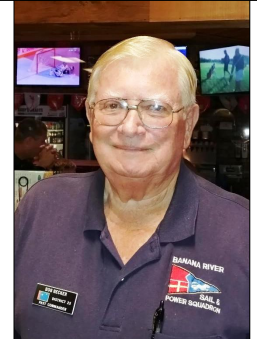

To commemorate Memorial Day, USS Constitution will host a Facebook live event honoring USS Constitution's fallen crew members at 11:30 a.m. and will fire a salute of 21 minute-guns at noon, May 25, 2020.

A commemoration will be hosted live on the ship's Facebook page to honor all past crew members who died while serving aboard USS Constitution during her active sailing years of 1798 to 1881: www.facebook.com/ussconstitutionofficial.

"USS Constitution is undefeated in battle, having captured or destroyed 33 enemy vessels, but that did not come without a significant cost," said Cdr. John Benda. "This ship is truly a battlefield like Gettysburg or Normandy, and we will never forget the sacrifice of the Sailors who perished on these decks in the defense of our nation."

Navy regulation directs all ships in the Navy, with a saluting battery, to fire gun salutes once a minute for 21 minutes beginning at noon to recognize Memorial Day.

USS Constitution Continued:

USS Constitution, is the world's oldest commissioned warship afloat, and played a crucial role in the Barbary Wars and the War of 1812.

On Memorial Day, the U.S. flag flies at half-staff in the morning, and is raised to full height following the 21-gun salute, a custom honoring those who have made the ultimate sacrifice in the morning and living veterans for the rest of the day.

During normal operations, the active-duty Sailors stationed aboard USS Constitution provide free tours and offer public visitation to more than 600,000 people a year as they support the ship's mission of promoting the Navy's history and maritime heritage and raising awareness of the importance of a sustained naval presence.

The ship earned the nickname of Old Ironsides during the war of 1812 when British cannonballs were seen bouncing off the ship's wooden hull.

The USS Constitution Museum serves as the memory and educational voice of USS Constitution by collecting, preserving, and interpreting the stories of "Old Ironsides" and those associated with her.

The Museum has also temporarily closed and is currently providing a hands-on, minds-on environment digitally during this time of physical distancing.

The National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA) announced that beginning in 2021, it will be eliminating the paper publications of the annual Tide Tables and Tidal Current Tables. All NOAA Tide Predictions and NOAA Current Predictions will continue to be available online in electronic form.

The NOAA website says, "The change from print to online tables allows us to modernize this long-standing product by bringing it into the digital age. Online predictions are more accurate and up to date than what is provided in the annual printed tables."

The online services will provide capabilities the printed publications cannot, which will better meet a variety of different user needs. Visit [NOAA's Tides & Currents website](#) to access NOAA tide predictions, or [NOAA's Tide & Currents Map](#) for current predictions by region. NOAA's tide and current predictions include all U.S. coastal stations and some islands in the Pacific and Caribbean

Alternatively, if you have a smartphone, you can have all that data available in the palm of your hand by downloading the free [BoatUS App](#) for iOS and Android.

"The BoatUS App makes it easy for all boaters to access tide forecasts for their favorite boating locations quickly and easily," said Mike Vatalaro, BoatUS digital innovation manager. "Creating a free account lets you save up to five locations and select the exact tide station you prefer as your reference point for each. You can also get weather buoy data so you can see current conditions on the water."

This is National Safe Boating Week and the lead in to Memorial Day Weekend!

The Board of Directors and Headquarters continue to work remotely on the behalf of squadrons and districts with the focus on our members and a watchful eye on our bottom line. We have some updates and new information for you as it pertains to conducting business:

A. With Regard to Squadron and/or District Meetings, Events, Activities, and more:
The first Message from the Chief Commander dated March 17, 2020, included a succinct statement regarding COVID 19 implications to the way our squadrons and districts function. Specifically "...for squadrons and districts to conduct business by the best available means while preserving the safety and security of our members".

I would like to reiterate that the Board of Directors is in agreement that the best way for our organization to deal with the ongoing health situation: locally at the squadron and district levels. To review:

1. First and foremost is preserving the health and well-being of our members (this includes those in the recreational boating public who seek our educational classes)
2. All squadrons and districts are to adhere to the local, state, and national directives concerning social distancing and stay at home initiatives
3. Tools are available and are continuing to be developed to assist with remote learning, virtual meetings, virtual classrooms, and virtual conferences.
4. There is no expectation or obligation to the squadrons or districts to host face-to-face (F2F) classes, meetings, or activities. Nor is there an obligation or expectation for our volunteers to attend or conduct same. (There is no penalty for erring on the side of caution!)
5. We are not issuing an edict from national on how to conduct squadron or district "business" during COVID-19, we are here to support the squadrons and districts as they choose given the above guidelines and smart hygiene practices.



C/C Message Continued:

B. Headquarters Business Hours Update

1. Effective Monday, May 19, 2020, hours for headquarters staff who work in customer service, membership, education, shipping, and accounting have been reduced to 3.5 hours per day. We will re-evaluate at the end of June.

2. We will continue shipping orders, responding to emails, phone calls, and accounting, membership, and education requests.

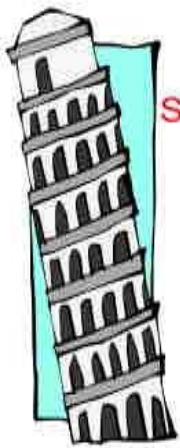
