Commodores Opening Remarks:

Pat opened the meeting by thanking all who came to the meeting, then introduced the Board of Governors, past commodores and committee chair persons who were present. We all thought we had new members attending but when Pat asked them to stand up and tell the club a little about themselves, it turned out they were long time members but haven't been to a meeting in a long time. So, we welcomed Dave and Sara Smith along with mother-in-law Mary. They are currently sailing a Catalina 22 but are looking to upgrade to a large cruising cat for live aboard and future island cruising.

Pat asked for a motion to approve the proposed bylaw changes, all members approved, and the motion was carried. The bylaw changes were to better define the roles and responsibilities of BOG members.

A big weekend coming up with St. Patrick's Day activities in downtown and the club cruise to The Mansion. Pat and Bruce's business, Fletcher Hauling, will have a float truck filled with little leprechauns participating in the downtown parade, don't miss it!

Pat gave a big thanks to John Boyd for all his hard work in updating the club website.

The commodore also mentioned we still need a membership committee member. Joe Coleman gave a run down on the duties for the membership position.

Pat also mentioned to members that if they don't have a dinghy, that shouldn't stop them from sailing to events as other members would be happy to provide ferry service to and from the dock or shoreline.

Vice Commodores Report:

Clyde started his report talking about the website and encouraging everyone to check their profiles to make sure their contact information was up to date. He also mentioned that we will be changing the way we send out the newsletter to help cut costs. The default will now be to receive the Foot, Tack & Clew by email or by link in the email. A member will now have to go to their profile and "opt in" to get a paper copy mailed to them. There will be a 2-month grace period before everyone is switched over to electronic copy. If any one has problems or questions about the website or their profiles please contact either Grover or John Boyd. He also mentioned that the St. Patrick's Day cruise had been advertised on the website but "free tickets" had not been set up so members could not sign up online for the cruise, but this has since been fixed. The Ships Store inventory is also now shown on the website store so members can see if an item is in stock before ordering it.
